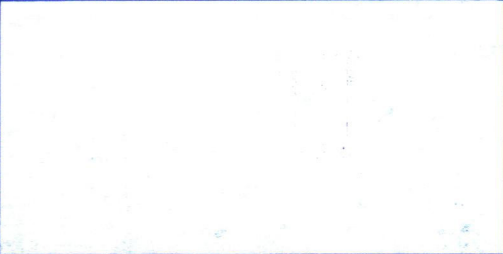

U.S. TRIVIA TRIP INSTRUCTIONS

You are about to leave on a fun, fact-filled journey throughout the U.S. Tally your way across the country trying to better your last score or out-travel the competition. But don't trip around—go through the questions in sequence (or you can also use the index to locate questions from one particular state).

FOR ONE PLAYER—Each solitaire quiz consists of a two-page spread, 28 questions. Write down your answers as you read through one column at a time. Then check your answers and go on to the next column.* Give yourself 4 points for each correct answer (there is no penalty for incorrect answers). The chart below will give you some idea of how well you traveled.

FOR TWO OR MORE PLAYERS—The Reader reads all the questions from one column, one question at

a time, to the player on the left. That player gets one point for each correct answer. Then that player reads one column to the person on his or her left. The game continues until each player has been the Reader twice (once if six or more play). The player with the highest score is the winner.

CHALLENGE PLAY—One player reads the first question. The first player to shout out the correct answer gets one point and then takes the booklet and reads the question in the next column on the same line as the previous question. (This keeps one player from monopolizing the game, and prevents players from seeing answers to subsequent questions.) The game ends when 28 questions have been read. The player with the most points is the winner.

MAP (BOARD) GAME—The map of the U.S. on pages 16 and 17 can be used to play a separate game of identifying the states (give yourself 2 points for each state you can name correctly). The map is also for playing the U.S. Trivia Trip board game: see how far you can travel across the U.S. on either route by starting on

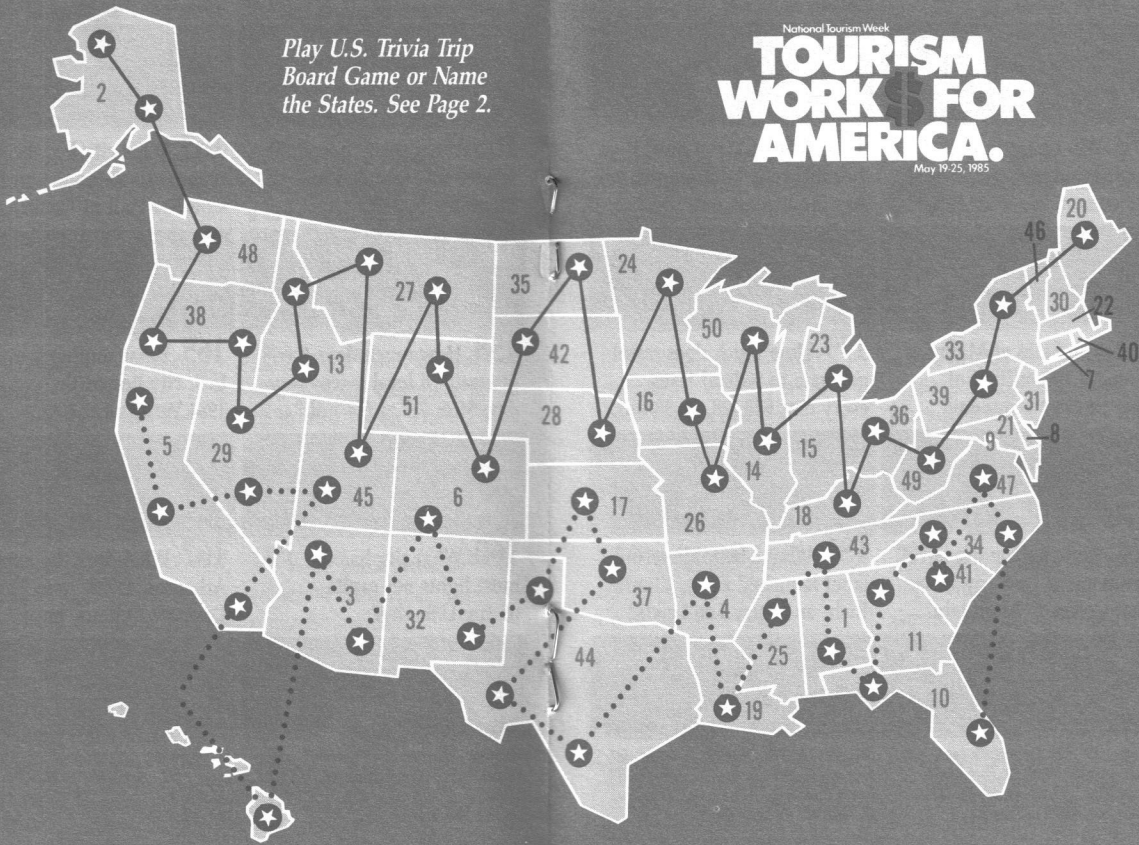
