Answers to all these questions will be found in the descriptive matter printed on the cards.

RULES FOR THE GAME OF BIBLE FAMILIES

This game consists of eleven books containing the names of the principal members of eleven families of Bible History. The Holy Family has been purposely omitted, being considered too sacred to be played with. The book numbers appear at the upper left-hand corner, and the card numbers of each book at the upper right. There are 52 cards in all.

FOUNDATION GAME. 1. Mix the cards well, and deal six to each player, placing the remainder, face down, in center of the table. This pile is called the Reserve.

2. The player at the left of the de ler plays first by calling on any player for a card that will help to complete any book in his hand. If the player called on for a card, has it, he gives it to first player, who continues to call for cards as long as successful. But if the player called on has not the card, the first

and can, of course, call all the rest, and have that book for himself.

SPELL DOWN. Choose sides, and divide the cards equally between the two leaders. Then the first leader asks the 2nd leader any question about the character named at top of 1st card drawn, answer to which can be found in description printed below, e.g., If 1st leader has Moses at top of 1st card, he may ask, "Who was the meekest man who ever lived?" etc. If answered correctly, 2nd leader wins the card. Continue until someone fails to give correct answer, then the player who fails must sit down. The 2nd leader then asks question of the first side. Play till cards are all given out, or players are all seated, at which time the side having the most cards is the winning side.

RELATIONSHIP. Choose sides. Have leader on Side 1 name, from memory, any character of any book, and call on one of opposite side to name the other members of that

family group, and tell what relation each one is to the first name given. If the first name given be Adam, the correct answer should be. Eve, his wife, Cain, Abel and Seth, his sons; or if the first name given be Moses, the correct answer should be Zipporah, his wife, Aaron, his brother, and Miriam, his sister. The one failing to give correct answers, sits down. When all players on one side are seated, the opposing side has won.

FAMILY HEADS. Played similarly to Foundation Game, but, instead of the object being the winning of books, it is the winning of cards marked No.1 of each book, which are the heads of the families, except in Book IV. In that book it is the most important son, Judah, from whose tribe the Saviour came, later. The one first getting

FAMILY TREE. Played similarly to Family Heads, but having as winning cards those having at the top the names of racial ancestors of our Lord, when on earth. Hence, in Book I, Cain and Abel would not count for points, and none of the characters in Books V, VIII, IX, X nor XI, and but one in Book IV, etc. There are 15 winning cards, in all, in this game, e.g., In Book III. the cards counting for points are Abraham, Sarah, Isaac and Jacob.

MOTHERS. Played similarly to Family Heads, but having for winning cards those bearing at the top the name of some character who was a mother, e.g., In Book VII. Bathsheba was a mother, but Michal, another wife of David was not; hence Bathsheba, only, in that Book, counts for a point. There are but 9 winning cards in this game. Discard Books II., IV., IX., and X., in playing this game.

A, B, C's. Played similarly to Foundation Game, but with the object being to group together all the characters whose names begin with the same letter, e.g., If you hold Adam, Jacob, Levi, Moses, Martha, and Eunice, in your hand at the beginning of the game, you match Moses and Martha, and call, in your turn, for as many characters as you can think of whose names begin with either A, J, L, M, or E. The rule in paragraph 3 of Foundation Game does not apply in this game. The one having the greatest number of MATCHED characters at the close, wins the game.

NEW TESTAMENT DOUBLE POINTS. Played like Foundation Game, but counting all the characters taken from the New Testament as double points, making 64 points in all instead of 52, as in the Foundation Game, e.g., The cards headed Zebedee, James and John each count two points instead of just one

RULES for PLAYING PARTNERS

Play according to rules for Foundation Game, with the addition of the two following rules:-

(1). As soon as cards are all dealt, and each player looks at the cards in his hand, partners ex-

change hands.
(2). When the last one of the reserve pile is drawn, partners exchange their cards again. The combined points of the two partners count against the combined points of the opponents.
