RUM-A-ZOO

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PLAYING THE GAME

Two, three, or four can play this novel game.

IMPLEMENTS: Four Framed pictures and 20 card pieces for each.

The object of the game, is to complete your picture ahead of the other players. When properly placed together, 20 pieces form one complete picture.

METHOD OF PLAYING: Place the 80 card pieces in the center of the table, face down, and give each player one frame to fill. The player who has "wild animals" frame is the first to select a piece from the center of the table. If it fits into his frame, he places this piece "face up" on the proper part of his picture, and continues to draw, filling his frame until a piece not belonging to his puzzle is found. This latter piece is returned to the center pile and mixed with it.

The next child, in turn, selects a card piece and play continues in the manner mentioned above. The player who first completes his or her puzzle wins the game.
