

"GABRIEL GAME"

GOOD THINGS TO EAT LOTTO

DIRECTIONS

An instructive and amusing pastime, played on the same principle as Lotto. The youngest children can join in this game, as no reading is required. For children with poor appetites, this game will also tend to arouse an interest in food.

The game consists of six fully colored cards each picturing six "good things to eat". From two to six children can play the game, the cards being evenly divided among them. All the counters, which are duplicate pictures of the objects on the cards, are piled face down upon the table, and one of the players is selected as the "caller". The caller takes one counter at a time from the heap and calls out the name of the object shown thereon. The players see if this object appears on the card or cards before them. Whoever has the picture on his card gets the counter, which is laid over the matching picture.
