"SLUGGER BASEBALL GAME"

DIRECTIONS FOR PLAYING

Set up as shown on sketch below.

Slugger Baseball Game may be played by one or more players.

The object of the game is for one player to score more runs than his opponent by shooting the darts at the target. When the target is hit, the arm is released throwing the ball.

The player should stand about ten feet away from the game.

Each player is given the opportunity to shoot three darts. If the dart hits on "One Base Hit," "Two Base Hit," "Three Base Hit" or "Home Run," and the player catches the ball he is credited with the result of the hit, the same as in baseball.

The scoring is done the same as in baseball. If, however, the dart falls off the target or if the dart completely misses the target, or if the player shooting does not catch the ball it is considered an "Out."

The game may be played with three outs and nine innings, the same as regular baseball, or players may make their own rules.





GAME NO. 2

Another method of playing this game is for the person shooting the gun to stand about six or eight feet away from the target. The person he is playing against to stand about six feet back of him. The player nearest the target shoots the dart; is credited with whatever he registers provided his opponent in back of him does not catch the ball. If his opponent catches the ball the player is out.

Otherwise the same rules apply for outs as above.
