## 4271 GYPSY FORTUNE TELLER

This game is founded upon the so-called science of Palmistry. Many of the references are in accord with its teachings, the others are introduced to add amusement.

## DIRECTIONS

Each player has one of the diagrams for reference. One of the players may also act as reader, or this part may be assigned to some person not otherwise in the game. The numbered cards are placed in the box face side down and then shaken up.

The player at the left of the reader begins the game by drawing a numbered card from the box and reading the number aloud. The reader then reads its indication. The next player plays, followed by the others in turn till all the numbered cards are exhausted. The player at the end of the game having received the greatest number of complimentary indications, wins the game.

This game may be used as a solitaire, the player pulling out twenty-five cards, their aggregate being taken as the fortune.
