

HAPPY FAMILY.

A GAME OF NATURAL
HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY.

Directions.

Place the five principal cards representing the continents face upwards in a row upon the center of the table. These cards remain in this position during the game.

Deal the cards representing the animals, one at a time in turn, to the players, till all are distributed.

The player at the left of the dealer begins the game by playing any card he chooses, placing it face upward before the continent to which the animal belongs, thus the Lion would be placed in front of Asia or Africa. The Horse being common to all may be played in front of any continent. When in doubt as to where a card may be placed, consult the list. Each player plays in turn, his object being to play to the continent that has the smallest number of cards unless he can so play that his card will make the third animal card in front of a continent, in which event he takes up the three animal cards and places them upon the table near him, they counting as one "Book" towards the game. The game proceeds, each player striving to obtain all the Books possible.

At the end, the player having the greatest number of Books wins the game.

An interesting addition for children is, as each card is played to imitate the noise of the animal represented upon the card, as the bark of the Dog, roar of the Lion, etc., etc. Also state the practical use of the animals, as the Elephant is used in Asia as a beast of burden, his tusks furnish ivory.
