

# BRADLEY'S TELEGRAPH GAME

An interesting and practical amusement which provides instructive entertainment for children.

The blanks furnished are fac-similes of those used by the great telegraph companies, and there is a stamp for marking the messages as they are written. The writing, sending and delivery of messages affords great fun, and the use of toy money to pay for the messages helps to make the play realistic.

## THE MORSE TELEGRAPH CODE

### DIRECTIONS FOR USE

There is a distinct sound for each dot or dash.

The dot is made by pressing the key down and releasing it instantly.

The dash is made by pressing the key down and allowing a short pause before releasing it.

The letters of the alphabet are sounded as follows:—
