

Directions for the Game.

In the box will be found a small book with 100 questions with answers and references. Also 100 cards with the answers to the 100 questions. Also 50 counters.

The method of play is as follows:—Let some one that may be selected by lot or election be the director. The director shall distribute the answer cards, one or two at a time, equally among the remaining players. Also distribute one-half of the counters equally among the players, retaining one-half himself. Now let the director read the first question, and any player that thinks he has the right answer may raise his hand. Then the director shall call for the reading of the answer. If the answer read proves to be correct, the director shall give the player so reading one counter. But if an answer is read that is not correct, then the player so reading shall give the director one counter. If two or more players hold up their hands at the same time, then the director shall call on the one nearest his left hand first and then on the next one. After all the questions have been read and answered, the player that has the greatest number of counters has won the game.

WHO KNOWS?

1. What account is there in the Bible of riddles?

Samson at his marriage feast gave a riddle to his wedding guests. Jud. xiv. 12-20.

2. What did Samson do to the Philistines for getting away his wife?

He caught three hundred foxes, and tied the tails of each two together, and put a fire-brand between them, and let them go into the standing corn. Jud. xv. 4, 5.

3. What captain was slain by a woman, and how?

Sisera. Jael Heber's wife took a nail of the tent, and took a hammer in her hand, and went softly unto him, and smote the nail

into his temple, and fastened it into the ground (for he was fast asleep, and weary.) So he died. Jud. iv. 21.

4. How many stalls did King Solomon have for his horses?

Forty thousand. I. Kings iv. 26.

5. Whom did God threaten to take away with fish-hooks?

The people of Israel that dwelt in the mountain of Samaria, and oppressed the poor, and crushed the needy. Amos iv. 1-2.

6. What building did God order made, that should be six times as long as it was wide, and ten times as long as it was high?

The ark. Gen. vi. 15.

7. Of what building did God give the plan that should be three times as long as it was wide and high?

The tabernacle. Ex. xxv. 10.

8. Who ate themselves out of their home?

Adam and Eve, when they took the forbidden fruit.

9. Who was Simeon?

The old man who took the child Jesus in his arms, and thanked God for letting him see him. Luke ii. 25-33.

10. Who was Zaccheus?

The little man who climbed into a tree to see Jesus. Luke xix. 2-4.

11. Who was Nicodemus?

The timid man who came in the night to have a talk with Jesus. John iii. 2.

12. Who had no new clothes for forty years, and whose old clothes needed no mending in all that time?

The children of Israel as they were going from Egypt to Canaan. Neh. ix. 21.

13. What is said about seven hundred left-handed men?

They could sling stones at a hair's-breadth and not miss. Jud. xx. 16.

14. Who was such a son of Belial that a man could not speak to him?

Nabal. I. Sam. xxv. 17.

15. What did Nebuchadnezzar's hair and nails grow to be like, and why?

His hair was like eagles' feathers, and his nails like birds' claws, because he took the glory to himself when he ought to have given it to God. Dan. iv. 30-33.

16. Who looked behind her when God told her not to, and what happened to her?

It was the wife of Lot, and she was turned into a pillar of salt. Gen. xix. 26.

17. Who first used a wooden pulpit?

Ezra, when he read the law in the streets to the men and women from morning till noon. Neh. viii. 3, 4.

18. When was there a rain in which there was no moisture?

When the Lord rained fire and brimstone upon Sodom and the other cities of the plain. Gen. xix. 24.

19. Who slept on an iron bedstead, and what was the length of it?

Og, the giant king of Bashan. It was fourteen feet long. Deut. iii. 11.

20. Who prayed "Wipe not out my good deeds?"

Nehemiah. Neh. xiii. 14.

21. Who, just before he killed himself, gave some money which was used to buy a burying-ground for strangers, and how did he get the money?

Judas Iscariot. He got the money for betraying Jesus. Matt. xxvii. 3-8.

22. What king used a penknife, and what did he do with it?

Jehoiakim. He cut the roll containing the prophecy of the seventy years' captivity, and then burnt up the pieces. Jer. xxxvi. 23.

23. Who carried the cross for Jesus when he was going to be crucified?

Simon, the Cyrenian. Matt. xxvii. 32.

24. What old man fell from his chair and broke his neck, and what made him fall?

Eli, a priest of Israel. He heard the ark of the Lord was taken by the Philistines. I Sam. iv. 18.

25. What remarkable man was slain by Jonathan, David's nephew?

A man of great stature that had on each hand six fingers and on each foot six toes. I. Chron. xx. 6.

26. Why could not Moses enter the land of Canaan?

He disobeyed God at Kadesh where he *struck* the rock instead of *speaking* to it, as God told him. Num. xx. 8-12.

27. Why could not his brother and sister go in?

They tried to quarrel with him about his wife. Num. xii. 1, 2.

28. How many of those that came out of Egypt did go in, and who were they?

Only two, Caleb, the son of Jephunnah, and Joshua, the son of Nun. Num. xiv. 30.

29. Jesus Christ had twelve friends who were with him all the time. Which of them was the talker?

Simon Peter.

30. Which one was the doubter?
Thomas.

31. Which one did not seem to comprehend him?

Philip.

32. Which one was the loving one?
John.

33. Which one did not love him and sold him for fifteen dollars?

Judas Iscariot.

34. Which one swore that he did not know him?

Simon Peter.

35. What was the trouble between Paul and Barnabas?

They quarreled about whom they should take to work with them. Acts xv. 36-39

36. How were a thousand men and women put to death in the tower of Shechem?

Boughs of trees were piled against the door, and set on fire, and they were smothered. Jud. ix. 48, 49.

37. Two Herods are mentioned in the Bible. Who were they?

Herod the Great, who killed all the little boys in Bethlehem who were not two years old, and Herod Antipas who cut off John the Baptist's head to please a dancing girl and her mother. Matt. xiv. 1-12; Mark vi. 14, 29.

38. What is the account of the first contribution box?

Jehoiada took a chest, and bored a hole in the lid, and set it beside the altar, on the right side as one cometh into the house of the Lord. And the priests put all the money therein that was brought into the house of the Lord. II Kings xii. 9.

39. How was the book of the law read in the days of Ezra?

Distinctly, and gave the sense. Neh. viii. 8.

40. How many Mary's are mentioned in the New Testament, and who were they?

Six:--The mother of Jesus, the mother of

Mark, the mother of James, the sister of Lazarus, the Magdalene, and a benevolent and useful Christian of Rome.

41. Who spoke against the gospel, and what happened to him?

Elymas. He was struck blind. Acts xiii. 8-12.

42. What beautiful building did Ahab erect?
A palace of ivory. I. Kings xxii. 39.

43. Where did Jesus tell Peter to get the money to pay their temple tax?

To take his hook, and go to the sea, and catch a fish, and there would be just enough to pay it in that fish's mouth. Matt. xvii. 27.

44. How did the Gibeonites make a treaty of peace with Joshua and the Israelites?

By strategy. They lived near but they put on old clothes, old shoes, old sacks, and took old wine bottles and old and mouldy bread, and said these things were all new when they started, and the bread was hot from the oven, and they had grown so old by the length of the journey. Josh. ix. 3-27.

* 45. When a man wanted to set his slave free, and the slave did not want to go, what must his master do?

Lead him to the door-post, and with an awl bore a hole through his ear into the door-post Ex. xxi. 5, 6.

* 46. King Hezekiah was once very sick, and the prophet Isaiah was sent to tell him he must die. On hearing it he turned away his face and prayed, weeping. What was the result?

The Lord heard him, and sent Isaiah back to tell him he would make him well and add fifteen years to his life. II Kings xx. 1-6.

* 47. Whose son was Hananiah, who helped to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem?

He was the son of an apothecary. Neh. iii. 8.

* 48. Jesus made three dead persons live again; who were they?

Lazarus, a young man of Nain, and a little daughter of Jairus.

* 49. How were three hundred men picked out of thirty-two thousand to fight one of the Lord's battles?

Gideon, their general, told all that were afraid to go home, and twenty-two thousand left: The Lord said there was still too many, and the remaining ten thousand was led to a brook to drink, and only those were taken who lifted up the water in their hands. Jud. vii. 3-7.

* 50. How did these three hundred gain the victory?

They made the attack in the night, and each took a trumpet in one hand and an empty pitcher with a lamp under it in the other, and they blew the trumpet and broke the pitcher at the same time. These noises woke the enemy and so frightened them that they slew each other with a very great slaughter. Jud. vii. 2-8.

* 51. What barren mountain burned with fire and shook, and when?

Mount Sinai, when God came down upon

it and spake the ten commandments. Ex. xix. 18.

52. A tree was once all on fire and yet was not burnt; when was it?

When the Lord came to tell Moses he wanted him to lead his people out of Egypt. Ex. iii. 2-10.

53. How was Jericho taken?

Once a day for six days an army of six hundred thousand men marched silently around the city accompanied by the ark of the Lord and seven priests who went before it blowing rams' horns. On the seventh day this was done seven times and then the people gave a great shout, and the walls fell flat. Josh. vi.

54. What was said would be the consequence if any one should rebuild it?

They should lose all their children; which proved true in the case of Hiel the Bethelite. I. Kings xvi. 34.

55. What house was built without the use of hammer or any tool of iron?

Solomon's temple. I. Kings vi. 7.

56. What was Babylon called, and what was done with it?

The hammer of the whole earth. It was broken in pieces. Jer. 1. 23.

57. When was the longest rain-storm?

The flood.

58. Of whom is it said I have made thee an iron pillar?

The prophet Jeremiah.

59. Who were the three favorite disciples of Jesus?

John, James and Simon Peter.

60. What boy was taught the Bible by his mother and grandmother, and what were their names?

Timothy, Lois and Eunice.

61. Who ate honey and locusts?

John the Baptist. Matt. iii. 4.

62. Who was Onesimus?

The servant who ran away from Philemon,

and Paul sent back to be treated as a brother. Phil. xii. 16.

63. What seven things are an abomination to the Lord?

A proud look, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, feet swift in running to mischief, a false witness, and him that soweth discord among brethren. Prov. vi. 16-18.

64. What four men sat upon the ground seven days and seven nights?

Job and his three friends, Eliphaz, Bildad and Zopher. Job ii. 11, 13.

65. Why did not the Ephraimites get away from the Gileadites at the fords of Jordan?

They could not give the pass-word correctly. It was Shibboleth, and they pronounced it Sibboleth. Jud. xii. 5, 6.

66. What doctor is called beloved?

Luke. Col. iv. 14.

67. Who asked Jesus to lunch with him, and how did he treat him?

Simon. He did not kiss him, and he gave him no oil for his head or water for his feet. Luke vii. 36, 44-47.

68. How many kings of Egypt are mentioned in the Bible, and what was the names of eight of them?

Twelve, and eight are called Pharaoh.

69. What very foolish thing did king Saul do?

He went in disguise to have a talk with the witch of Endor. I. Sam. xxviii. 7, 8.

70. Who had a beautiful coat given him by his father, and under what circumstances did his father receive it again?

Joseph. When his brothers sold him they took it off, and putting some kid's blood on it, they brought it to their father and said they found it so. Gen. xxxvii. 3, 31, 32.

71. With what three persons did the Son of God once take a walk?

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, in that fiery furnace when it was heated seven times

hotter than it ever was before. Dan. iii. 19, 20, 24, 25.

72. What was a young boy musician employed to do, and what was his name?

David. He played upon his harp to soothe the crazy King Saul.

73. What wonderful thing did he do when he was a little older?

He slew with a sling and stone the giant Goliath, who for forty days had challenged the armies of Israel. I. Sam. xvii.

74. Who was killed by a long sermon, and how?

Eutychus. He was sitting in the window, and as Paul was long preaching he dropped asleep and fell out of the window, and was picked up dead. Acts xx. 9.

75. What did the wicked queen Jezebel do to her face?

Painted it. II. Kings ix. 30.

76. Who made an axe float on the water?

Elisha. II. Kings vi. 5, 6, 7.

77. Who was John the Baptist?

The cousin of Jesus and the one who told the Jews the Messiah had come.

78. What was the first murderer's punishment?

Nothing would grow which he should plant, he was to be a fugitive and a vagabond, and worse than all else God put a mark on him. Gen iv 12, 15.

79. Who named her little boy as she was dying. What did she call him, and what did his father name him afterwards?

Rachel. Benoni. Benjamin. Gen. xxxv. 18.

80. Why did Abraham and Lot separate? Their herdmen quarreled. Gen. xiii. 7-9

81. How did Lot show that he was selfish? By choosing the best ground instead of letting his old uncle Abraham have the choice. Gen xiii. 10, 11.

82. If Methuselah had lived thirty-one years longer how old would he have been?

One thousand. Gen. v. 27.

83. What did Rachel steal from her father?

His gods. Gen. xxxi. 19.

84. How did a woman hide two of God's people in Jericho?

She covered them with stalks of flax on the roof of her house. Josh. ii. 6.

85. What Persian queen disobeyed her husband, and why?

Vashti. He wished her to come to him without her veil that his companions might see how handsome she was. Esther i. 10-13.

86. What was commenced on the plains of Shinar, and why was it not finished?

A city, and in it a very high tower. It was not finished because God introduced the different languages and they could not understand each other. Gen. xi. 2-9.

87. Who sent a servant to do the courting for his son. What were their names?

Abraham. Eliczer the servant. Isaac the son. Rebekah the young lady. Gen. xxiv. 4, 61.

88. How did Uzzah lose his life?

He attempted to steady the ark of the

Lord as it was being moved on a cart from one place to another. II. Sam. vi. 3-8.

89. Who was Delilah?

She was a bad woman who got from Samson the secret that his strength was in his hair, and as he slept with his head in her lap, she had a man cut it off. Jud. xvi. 16-20.

90. What young and handsome widow went into the fields of a rich bachelor to glean after the reapers, and what did she get besides grain?

Ruth. She got a husband for she married the bachelor Boaz. Ruth ii. 2, 3, 10.

91. Where is it said two or three cities wandered into one city to drink?

In Amos iv. 8. It was when God sent drouth upon the children of Israel for their sins.

92. Where did Paul live two years?

In his own hired house at Rome. Acts xxviii. 30.

93. What two rich men honored Christ?

Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea.

94. When did a large company take their kneading troughs on their backs and start on a journey ?

When the children of Israel left Egypt for Canaan.

95. What twins are mentioned in the Bible ? Esau and Jacob.

96. Who tried to run away from God, and what happened to him ?

Jonah. God told him to go to Nineveh to preach.
