# POPULATIONS

An Instructive Fun-Making Game

Populations is for any number of players, from three to eight. It is best for four, five, six or seven.

Shuffle the cards thoroughly and **deal the entire pack.**

If the cards do not go around evenly, set aside the last card or two which over run and do not use same.

One of the players calls "GO" whereupon each player having selected **any card that he chooses from his hand, extends it, face down,** on the table, towards the centre of the table. All players play at once.

The dealer then cries "TURN" and each player turns his card revealing the name of the city and its population. **The card bearing the highest population of those played captures the cards played,** which are then set aside to be counted for the player who captured them.

The dealer then calls "GO" again, and each player puts down any other card he wishes in the same way, all turning them up at the same moment, when the dealer calls "TURN" the highest population always taking the trick played.

The game continues until all the cards have been played and taken. **Each card which a player captures counts one point; the city of Washington, being the capital of the country, counts 25 points. The winner of the game is the first player who wins 100 points.**

NOTE.—It will be seen after playing populations for a little while that considerable judgment can be used as to best probable time to play high cards (large cities). To capture **Washington** is of course a most important gain.
