

B. SECOND BANKRUPTCY METHOD. On the First Bankruptev occurring, the Bankrupt retires from the game. On the Second Bankruptcy the Banker as soon as he has made certain that the player cannot with any property he owns meet his obligations calls "Game Ends". Play immediately ceases (See above), the Bankrupt player (when this form of game is played) turning over to his Creditor all that he has of value, including buildings with all other propertieswhether the creditor happens to be a rival player or the Bank.

NOTE: If desired to shorten this method still further, at Start of Game Banker shuffles and deals Two Title Deeds to each player as described in "Time Limit Game".


