INSTRUCTIONS.

CAME OF POETS.

Each set is composed of four cards. The object of the game is to obtain the most sets. After the cards have been dealt as equally as possible, the person on the Dealer's left asks for a card from ANY ONE; if he obtains it, he continues; if he fails, the person on HIS left asks, and so on in rotation.

No person can ask for any card unless he has one of THAT SET in his hand. Players must be careful to ask for and to give the card in LARGE CAPITALS.

Always ASK FOR ONE OF THE NAMES in small letters WHICH YOU HAVE NOT IN CAPITALS. If a player asks for a card which he has himself, that card is forfeited to the person whom he asks.

Each set is numbered.
