

COCK ROBIN,

IN TWO ACTS.

DIRECTIONS.

Turn the numbered blocks up in regular order, beginning with No. 1, then arrange the part illustrating the death of Cock Robin, after placing Nos. 1 and 2, reading the account of his death.

FIRST SCENE.—The Death of Poor Cock Robin.

PART 1.—Who killed Cock Robin? I, said the Sparrow, with my bow and arrow, I killed Cock Robin.

PART 2.—Who caught his blood? I did, said the Fish, in my little dish, I caught his blood.

PART 3.—Who saw him die? I did, said the Fly, with my little eye, I saw him die.

TO ARRANGE FOR THE FUNERAL SERVICES.

Build entrance to the cemetery for second part, turn the numbered parts up, read from each part placing in a corresponding block as you read. So continue until all the blocks are in their places.

SECOND PART.—Funeral Services.

Block 3.—Who'll dig his grave? I will, said the Owl, with my spade and shovel, I'll dig his grave. Who'll make his shroud? I, said the Beetle, can bring thread and needle, so I'll make his shroud.

Block 4.—Who'll be chief mourner? I, said the Dove, for I mourn for my love, so I'll be chief mourner.

Block 5.—Who'll carry him to the grave? I will, said the Kite, I can come out at night, so I'll carry him to the grave.

Block 6.—Who'll bear the torch? I, said the Lantern, can fetch it in a minute, so I'll bear the torch.

Block 7.—Who'll bear the pall? We, says the Wren, both the Cock and the Hen, and we'll bear the pall.

Block 8.—Who will be Parson? I will, said the Rook, I have a book, so I will be Parson. Who will be Clerk? I will, said the Lark, I can sing in the dark, so I will be Clerk.

Block 9.—Who will come and sing? I, said the Thrush, if others will hush, I'll come and sing.

Block 10.—Who'll toll the bell? I, said the Bull, because I can pull, I'll toll the bell.
