

Dog Race

"Gold Medal" Dog Race is a very exciting and fascinating racing game. From two to six players can play this fast-moving game and enjoy the thrills of a real dog race.

Dog Race can be run in two different ways---a straight race or a steeplechase race.

First, let us run the dogs in a straight race. Each player selects the dog he wishes to race. Then line up the dogs in the **Start** position, the green number one dog on the green #1 track, the orange #2 dog on the orange #2 track, etc. Then each player takes turns to role out the 3 dice. Each dog is moved every time his number appears on the rolled dice. For example: a #4, #5, #6 are rolled on the dice. Dogs #D 4, 5, And 6 are therefore moved ahead one space each. If the dice show 4, 4, and 6, the #4 dog would move ahead 2 spaces and the #6 dog would move 1 space, the other dogs remaining stationary. If one dog appears on the three dice in one roll, that numbered dog is moved the three spaces ahead. The race continues and the first dog over the finish line is the winner.

The steeplechase race is run in the same way except that you erect the two hurdles on the track in the places shown. Now, the differences between the two races is---in steeplechase, in order to jump across a hurdle or leap across a water hazard, it is necessary to role a double on the dice. For example: if the #6 dog is in the third space from the start, which is the space before the hurdle, two # 6's (which is known as a double) must appear on the roll of the dice before this dog can proceed on the track. Now, if a dog lands into a water hazard, a double is also needed to move him forward to the next space.

The game playing money in this game may be used to buy and sell the dogs if you so desire.
