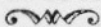


RULES FOR PLAYING RING TOSS

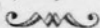


There is twice as much fun playing "Gold Medal" Ring Toss. You play it twice as fast because you have TWO bases. To get your game of Ring Toss set up, you have only to insert the posts into the bases. The ideal way to play is to have the two opposing players (or teams) stand at an agreed distance apart, with one base placed in front of each rival. This eliminates the need for walking back and forth to pick up the rings.

You then try to toss the rings over the post in front of your rival. Every time you succeed, you get 5 points. The player reaching the score of 100 points first wins the game.

Here is another way to play Ring Toss. The base of your game has numbers printed on it. In addition to the 5 points counted when a ring is tossed over the post, if the wooden bead on the ring falls onto one of the numbers, that number is counted in the score. For instance, if your ring falls over the post, and the bead lands on number 5, you have scored 10 points, (5 and 5).

Before starting the game, the players can decide among themselves what the winning score will be, depending on how long a game they may want to play.
