**RULES FOR CONTEST.**

(1). The object of the contest is to complete the Puzzles in as short a time as possible. The Competitor who puts all the Puzzles together in the shortest time is the Winner.

(2). The score should be kept by a non-player, who, after removing the specimen Postcard on the top, hands one of the Puzzle cards to each Competitor.

(3). The Competitor upon completing a Puzzle must hand it to the score-keeper, who records the time taken, and re-distributes the Puzzles until each one has been put together by every player.

(4). The Score-keeper is at liberty to impose a time limit for putting each Puzzle together.

*These Rules apply equally to 6, 9, 12 or more Players, the same number of different Puzzle Postcards as there are Players being required. Additional scoring sheets must be used where there are more than 6 Players.*
