FORTUNE TELLING WITH CARDS.

Hitherto only thirty-two cards have been used in the French and Italian method of telling fortunes; now we use the whole pack of fifty-two. The significations also slightly differ. We shall first give a complete list of them and then describe how the cards are to be arranged, so as to explain their meanings.

CLUBS.

- Ace—Wealth, happiness and peace of mind.
- King—A dark man, upright, faithful and affectionate disposition.
- Queen—A dark woman, gentle and pleasing.
- Knave—A sincere but hasty friend; also a dark man's thoughts.
- Ten—Unexpected riches and loss of dear friend.
- Nine—Disobedience to friends wishes.
- Eight—A covetous man; also warns against speculation.
- Seven—Promises good fortune and happiness, but bids a person beware of the opposite sex.
- Six—Predicts a lucrative business.
- Five—A prudent marriage.
- Four—Cautions against inconstancy, or change of object for the sake of money.
- Three—Shows that a person will be more than once married.
- Deuce—A disappointment,

- Ace—A letter, from whom and about what is seen from neighboring cards.

Deuce—Great success; but equal care and attention needed to secure it.

SPADES.

Ace—Great misfortune; spite.

King—A dark, ambitious man.

Queen—A malicious, dark woman, usually a widow.

Knave—An indolent, envious person; a dark mans thoughts.

Ten—Grief; imprisonment.

Nine—A card of very bad import.

Eight—Warns a person to be cautious in his undertaking.

Seven—Loss of a friend, attended with much trouble.

Six—Wealth through industry.

Five—Shows that a bad temper needs correcting.

Four—Sickness.

Three—A journey.

Deuce—A removal.

Having given the signification of the various cards, we shall now proceed to describe how they are to be employed. After having well shuffled, cut them three times and lay them out in rows of nine cards each. Select any king or queen you please to represent yourself, and wherever you find that card placed, count nine cards every way reckoning it as one, and every ninth card will prove the prophetic one. Be-

fore, however, beginning to count, study well the disposition of the cards, according to individual and relative signification. If a married woman consults the cards she must make her husband king of the same suit of which she is queen. But if a single woman she may make any favorite male friend king of whatever suit she pleases.

As the knaves of the various suits represent the thoughts of the different persons represented by the picture cards of a corresponding color, they also should be counted from.

To try whether you will get your wish, shuffle the cards well, all the time keeping your thought fixed upon whatever wish you have formed; cut them once and remark what card you cut; shuffle them again and deal them out into three parcels. Examine each of these in turn, and if you find the card you turned up next either the one representing yourself, the ace of hearts, or nine of hearts you will get your wish. If it be in the same parcel with either of these, without being next them, there is a chance of your wish coming to pass at some more distant period; but if the nine of spades makes its appearance you may count on being disappointed.

Charm to hinder from the bite of a Mad Dog.

The tooth of a mad dog, which has bitten any human person, tied in leather, and then hanged at the shoulder, will preserve and keep the wearer from being bitten of any mad dog so long as he wears it. It may be worn next the skin, or concealed in the clothing.
