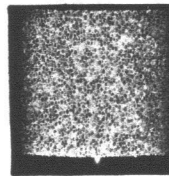

DIRECTIONS

Any number of persons up to ten can play the game.

The dealer, or reader, distributes the cards among the players. If there are any odd cards, they are thrown in the center of the table face up. The reader does not take any cards.

The reader then takes the list of questions and reads any question he chooses, announcing the number. The player holding the card with the corresponding number reads the answer from his card aloud and throws the card to the center of the table, face up.

The reader continues to read questions at random, keeping a tally on the enclosed slate, which are answered by players holding the corresponding cards. The player getting rid of his cards first wins.

The answer may be changed in such a way as to make the humor purely local.
