The Question Bee Game

Questions and Answers—right or wrong? You'll have loads of fun with these questions and answers that give you a chance to sharpen up your wits and improve your ability to think and express yourself clearly.

It's fun for young and old alike to hold a Question Bee right at home—it's interesting, entertaining and educational and provides a barrel of fun as each contestant battles to pile up the highest score. Here are the simple rules:

1. One member of the group must be selected beforehand to act as the Professor, who will be in charge of the game, asking all the questions and serving as the sole judge as to whether any question has been answered correctly.
2. The deck of cards, which carries both the questions and answers, should be thoroughly shuffled and placed face down in the middle of the table, preferably in a box.
3. To start the game, the player at the Professor's left should draw a card from the pile and without looking at the face of the card or showing it to any of the other players, hand it to the Professor.
4. The Professor then asks the player who has drawn the card the question which is printed on the card and the player is given a reasonable time limit to answer the question correctly.
5. If the player does answer the question correctly, the card is then awarded to that player to keep in front of him until the game is completed. Note: The player does

not have to answer in the exact words that appear on the card but merely in a manner which satisfies the Professor that the player is correct.

6. If the player cannot answer the question correctly within the designated time limit, the card is returned to the bottom of the pile by the Professor and the game proceeds. Players who know the answers to other player's questions should not reveal them until such time as they might draw the same card.
7. The next player to the left then draws a card in the same manner as described in Rule 3 and the play proceeds, continuing to the left, until each player has drawn six cards or a certain number of cards determined beforehand.
8. Players who answer their questions correctly are awarded the cards on which their questions and answers appear, while those who cannot answer miss their turn until the next time around.
9. At the end of the game, the player with the greatest number of cards is declared the winner and is automatically elected to act as Professor in the next game.
10. If, at the end of the game, there are one or more questions which none of the players have been able to answer, the Professor may read them aloud to all players after the game has been declared complete.

GROUP PLAY • It is also fun when playing with a group of 4 or more. Divide the players into 2 sides who will compete against each other.

The question cards are selected at random in the manner mentioned above and the Professor asks the question in turn from a player on one side and then a player on the other side, the players on either side taking turns in answering.

When a player fails to answer a question correctly he is out of the game. The side answering the most questions correctly wins the game.
