No. 59 POST OFFICE GAME

This Game may be played by any number of children. Select one of the children to be the Postmaster, another one to be the Letter Carrier and the remaining children are to represent the Letter Writers and the People who receive the letters. Then rig up a cardboard box to represent a Letter Box, also fix a Table or some other object to represent the Post Office

To play this Game, the Postmaster is given the cancelling stamp and has charge of the Post Office. The Postman calls at regular intervals at the Letter Box, takes out any letters that may be enclosed and takes them into the Post Office, where the Postmaster inspects them to see if they have the proper amount of stamps, etc., and if they are all satisfactory, he cancels the stamp with the little rubber cancelling stamp. He then gives the letters to the Postman, who distributes them to the parties to whom they are addressed.

The party who wants to mail a letter, writes his message on a plain piece of paper, folding same, and places it in the envelope. They then address the envelope by giving the name of the party to whom they wish the letter to go; under this they write the street address, under the street address they write the city, and under the city write the state. They then place the stamp in the upper right-hand corner and drop the letter in the Letter Box, where it will be collected by the Postman. (Do not post these letters in regular Let-

ter Boxes.)
