

Uncle Sam's Wits Game

Educational, Interesting and Picturesque

1st. This game is played by matching the States and their respective Capitals correctly together.

Shuffle all the cards thoroughly, and then deal six cards to each player, and place the remaining cards on centre of table, then each player in turn draws one card at a time from the stack on the centre of table, and when the stack is all drawn, then each player in turn discards one card at a time that they do not want, and picking up such cards that they do want to match their hand and when all the cards are correctly matched up *the one having the most cards wins the game.*

2nd. Another way to play Uncle Sam's Wits Game

Separate the cards, States from Capital cards, and place the Capital cards all on the table, face up, then deal the State cards out equally one at a time among the players. The dealer then says "Go" and every player picks the Capital cards from the table as fast as possible to match their hand. The one matching up their hand first correctly "States and Capitals" wins the game.

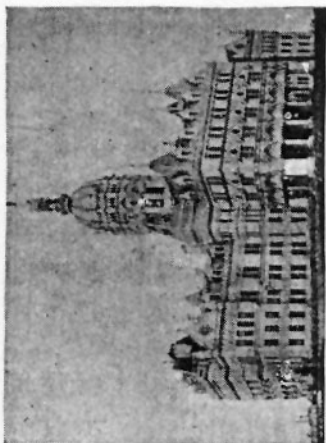

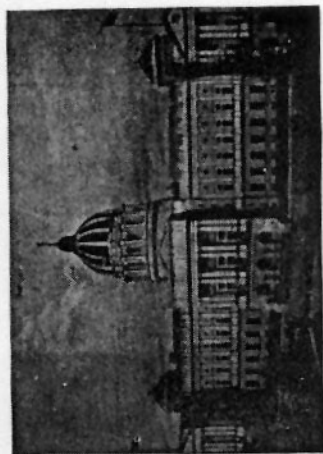
